# Eadar an Saghal 's a' Bhiothbhuan Between the World and Eternity

In 2006 Urras Shomhairle embarked on an ambitious project to bring the poetry of Sorley MacLean to a wider audience by:

- Commissioning the best traditional composers to set some of Sorley's poems to music or compose new music inspired by Sorley's work
- Establishing a Gaelic and a Music Residency at Sgoil Chiùil na Gaidhealtachd - the National Centre of Excellence in Traditional Music at Plockton - to work with the students to create musical settings to some of Sorley's poems and to new Gaelic poems created by the students themselves.

The Trust appointed Kenneth Thomson as Project Director and he, in turn, appointed the residents, composers and performers. The result was a programme of some of the best music created in recent years.

The concerts were held in June 2007 in Plockton, Fort William, Portree, Clashmore, Inverness and Dingwall.
